## NEXT STEPS TOWARDS THE PROPOSED REPURPOSING





The Interim Governance Group continue to hui once or twice a month. Their most recent mahi has been to:

- Update and confirm the latest version of a Tuāpapa (Deed) setting out the terms of the foundation document creating a Hāto Petera Board as the governance group to take this kaupapa forward. The next steps are for legal reviews of the Tuāpapa and then for the draft document to be reviewed by Kaumatua Rōpū and Bishop
- A Memorandum of Understanding has been agreed between Hāto Petera Limited and the Catholic Diocese of Auckland to make K7 available as a space of manaakitanga from February 2025.
- Planning has begun for the next Hāto Petera Hui-a-Whanau scheduled for Saturday 9 November 2024.

# TE KĀMAKA MARAE CHAIRMAN REPORT



Te Kāmaka Marae has been established for over a year now, since 2023-2024.

'Ko Rangitoto te maunga. Ko Te Waitemata te moana. Ko Te Kopua ō Matakerepō me Te Kopua ō Matakamokamo ngā puna waiora. Ko Te Onepoto te onepū. Ko Pupuke te awa. Ko Te Whenua Roa o Kahupara te papa whenua. Ko Te Kāmaka te marae. Ko Te Kāmaka te whare tipuna. Ko Hato Petera te waka. Ko Hehu Karaiti te poutokomanawa. Ko Tipene te Pihopa.'

Te Kāmaka Marae is connected and associated with the Auckland Catholic Diocese, the Interim Governance Committee, Te Kāhui Kaumātua Council, Hato Petera Limited, and we have a formal MOU relationship with the Transformation Academy. We are a committed group of volunteers and people of all cultures, iwi, and hapū who have supported the revitalization and reopening of Te Kāmaka Marae.

In 2023, we held a properly mandated hui to establish a committee by the people, for the people of Te Waka ō Hato Petera. This mandate, given by the community, iwi, our Catholic Church, past pupils, past families, and our Bishop—all who have a close association with Te Waka ō Hato Petera—resulted in the formation of our marae committee.

We launched the reopening of Te Kāmaka and established our cultural research and archives for our taonga housed at the back of our marae. Over the past year, we have achieved the following:

- Re-established Te Kāmaka Marae.
- Fully consulted with the other three marae on the North Shore.
- Hosted multiple bookings and hui, with our marae being fully active.
- Welcomed approximately 4,500 people through our marae in less than a year.

• Continued our Northcote Matariki events for the community at Te Kāmaka Marae in partnership with the Kai Pātiki Community Board.

• Hosted community tangi, schools, sports clubs, church events, cultural events, healing and spiritual events, kapa haka, pest and rodent control meetings, Te Tiriti ō Waitangi and Te Whakaminenga hui, Waka Ama events and training, gang events, graduations, filming, and recording of sound throughout the marae in relation to its acoustics.

• Engaged in other projects, consultation hui for the repurposing of Hato Petera, and corporate events.

# TE KĀMAKA MARAE CHAIRMAN REPORT CONTINUED

In the first 12 months (2023-2024), these are the accomplishments of Te Kāmaka Marae.

It is a privilege and an honor to be a committee member on the Te Kāmaka Marae Committee for Te Waka ō Petera. Our committee is responsible for:

- Looking after our marae, Te Kāmaka.
- Ensuring the safety of all its grounds, buildings, land, and car parking areas.
- Protecting the mauri of our marae, Te Kāmaka.
- Performing and upholding our cultural and spiritual ceremonies,
- values, beliefs, and traditions as a committee working together.
- Working together as a whānau under the guidance of the Auckland Catholic Diocese, the Interim Governance Board, Te Kāhui Kaumātua Council, our Chapel, and Hato Petera Limited.
- Honoring our MOU relationship with the Transformation Academy.
- Providing pōhiri, mihi whakatau, whaikōrero, karanga, karakia, waiata mōteatea, and waiata whakangāhau, kōrero tuku iho, and

manaakitanga services of food, accommodation, and sleeping facilities to all our manuhiri, no matter who they are or where they come from.

• Ensuring the cultural and spiritual safety of all who use Te Kāmaka Marae.

• Imparting, nurturing, and preserving all the history of Te Kāmaka Marae.

• Ensuring that all our manuhiri are safe and respected while at Te Kāmaka Marae.

• Creating strong and meaningful relationships internally and externally.

• Upholding Te Ao Māori (the Māori way of life), Te Ao o Te Moana Nui ā Kiwa (Pacifica nations), Te Ao Katorika (the Catholic way of life), and Te Ao Hurihuri (all cultures and living in the now) in all operations of Te Kāmaka Marae.
